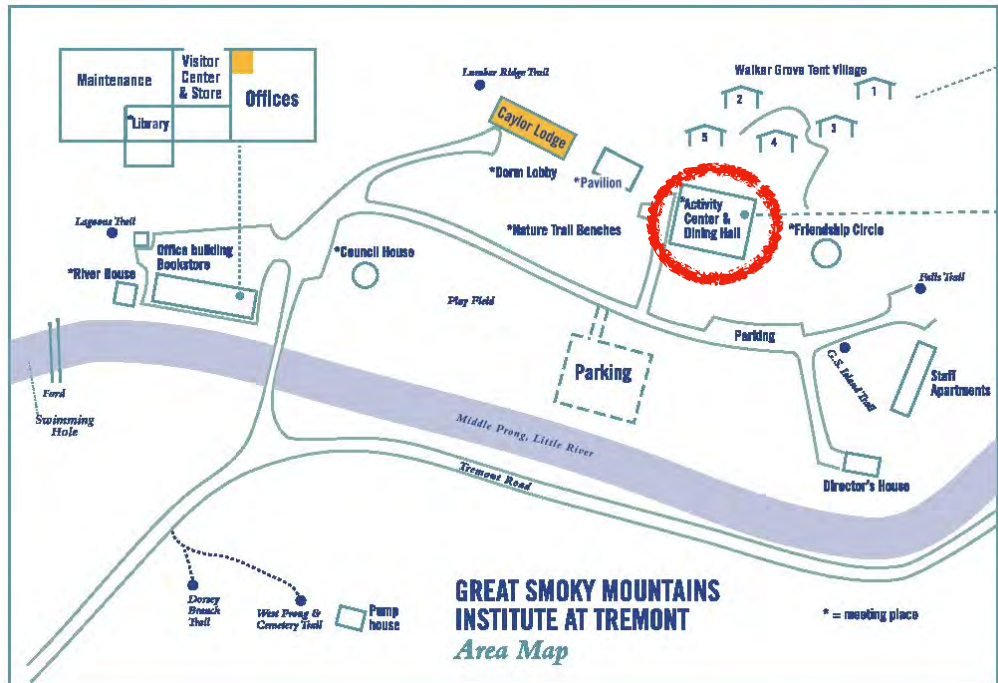

## DIRECTIONS TO THE GREAT SMOKY MOUNTAINS INSTITUTE AT TREMONT

**Maryville College**—502 E. Lamar Alexander Pkwy / Maryville, TN to **Great Smoky Mountains Institute at Tremont** / 9275 Tremont Rd / Townsend, TN

Tremont is some 35 minutes by car from MC (22.4 miles). **There is no cell phone reception in the national park, so enter GPS directions before departing for Tremont.**

- Turn right on to US-321 N/E Lamar Alexander Pkwy.
- Drive straight for approximately 30 minutes until you arrive in the Great Smoky Mountains National Park.
- Continue straight on Townsend Entrance Road.
- Bear right at the “Townsend Y” (a ‘Y’ in the river) and turn right at the intersection on to Laurel Creek Road.
- In .2 miles, turn left on Tremont Road.
- Stay on Tremont Road for a little over 1 mile.
- Turn left at the Tremont sign and cross the wooden bridge into the Tremont parking lot.
